Not long after my family moved to Napa in 1999, I attended a Napa Valley Dog Training Club general meeting. Providing Smiles (LAPS)?
Quickly Carolyn with her cocker, Bailey, and Laura Ecklin with her goldens, Jilly and Jasmine, also became registered animalassisted therapy teams with the national Delta Society's / Pet Partner Program. They joined me at Browns Valley Elementary school where we worked alongside the school's speech therapist and special educational instructor with students weekly. Carolyn also joined me on visits to The Springs and Aegis of Napa in the evenings sharing time with older adults. By 2001 we were an official group with 9 Pet Partner teams who were working with a variety of clients and in multiple facilities.

I've been looking back on our ten years and a lot has happened. Our group has tested and trained nearly 50 teams, many retired now. Some of these exceptional people and pets came from our club and training classes, and helped shape the group's goals and therapy programs. Sadly we lost Carolyn Lenzi, in December 2005. Carolyn's love of learning and commitment to young people was very apparent and to honor her memory our group developed CAPERS (Children and Pets Enjoy Reading Success) in 2008. This reading program allows LAPS teams who have completed additional specialized
training to work one-on-one with children in schools, afterschool programs and libraries.
LAPS currently has 20 certified therapy teams and we work with special needs
